Adults: 25p per class (£1 for 5 entries, £2 for 10 or more) Children 16 years or under: Free.
- The judge's decision is final. Points are awarded as follows for all classes
 - 1st Prize 5 points; 2nd Prize 3 points; 3rd Prize 2 points
- The Brooks Trophy is awarded to the person with the most points overall, and there are other trophies for most points in each section and various best exhibits.

Class 37 – Boiled Fruit Cake Recipe	
4oz Margarine, 6oz Brown Sugar	
14oz Mixed Fruit (with candied peel)	
8 fl oz water, 1 level teaspoon Bicarb	
1 heaped teaspoon Mixed Spice	
Place in saucepan and bring to boil then simmer for 1 minute. Pour into mixing bowl and allow to cool.	
2 beaten eggs, 4oz plain flour	
4oz Selfraising flour and a pinch of salt	
Add to cooled mixture, mix well. Pour into 8" round cake tin and cook at 350 F, 180C or Gas 4 for 1 ¼ hours or until cooked
